



Notices of Race

The Notice of Race (NoR) is a document that announces an event and sets out the conditions under which the racing will be run. It allows a competitor to decide whether to participate in the event and to understand the general structure of the racing.

NoR format

The NZRYA publishes a standard NoR template on its website. Not all NoRs will follow the template, but all championship events in New Zealand are required to use the template and be submitted to NZRYA for approval before publication.

What to look for

The NoR should include at least the following for the information of competitors.

1. The title, venue and date of the race or event.
2. Name of the organising authority.
3. A list of all the documents that will govern the event. This might include such documents as class rules, the arbitration process, the heat management system to be utilised.
4. Any RRS, Appendix E or Class Rules that will be changed
5. The classes to be raced, conditions of entry and eligibility of competitors
6. The times for registration and scheduled races.
7. Requirements for equipment inspection or measurement.
8. The scoring system to be used.
9. Any prizes being offered
10. The entry form
